

ADVANCED THEATRE TROUPES | 24/25 AUDITION PACKAGE

The Arts Umbrella Pre-Professional Theatre Program consists of Theatre, Film, Musical Theatre, and Sketch Comedy & Improv Performance Troupes. These yearlong programs are structured to offer aspiring artists a space to sharpen their skills, increase their confidence, and expand their network. A balance of process and production, students develop teamwork and cooperation, discipline and technique, creative expression, and individual artistry.

Our instructors are industry professionals who help students explore their artistic potential. Many of our students have gone on to post-secondary theatre programs and professional acting careers around the world.

The Arts Umbrella Pre-Professional Theatre Program is a September to June commitment (with extra rehearsals around performance times). Students **MUST** be prepared to put a lot of energy and time into training and preparation for performances. Participants are chosen by audition to take part in the program and will be placed in the Troupe that best fits their age, experience, interests, skill set, and goals.

Important note: Our Pre-Professional Program is designed for those who are considering theatre and the performing arts as a career path. A significant amount of at-home preparation and regular attendance is expected of all students. Missed classes may require changes in casting for our productions. Families are asked to consider this carefully when choosing to audition for the program.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

Theatre Troupe

Channel your talents! In Theatre Troupe, teens develop on- and off-stage skills. Beyond honing performance techniques, students also experiment with production know-how such as lighting, sound, costume, and set. The Fall Session is dedicated to intensive training that develops strong rehearsal techniques and encourages a sense of ensemble. Winter and Spring Sessions focus on mounting a professional production to tour Metro Vancouver schools. Students also showcase their work as a part of Winter Shorts, the Expressions Festival, and other performance opportunities throughout the year.

Musical Theatre Troupe

Young performers train with professional musical theatre artists to gain valuable ensemble and solo performance experience and enhance the special connection between performers and audiences. Actors can expect to expand their audition repertoire, develop their voice, and learn advanced singing, dancing, and acting techniques. Musical Theatre Troupe members showcase their work as a part of Winter Shorts, and end the year with either a full-length or school length Broadway Musical as part of our Expressions Festival, and a solo performance as part of our cabaret evenings, and other performance opportunities throughout the year.

The Actor's Film Troupe

Take a deep breath and dive into the art of acting for film. There is so much that goes into creating a great film; from sound, lights, and cinematography, to casting, acting, and directing. Understanding how it all works together, each adding its own artistic expression to a film, is key to becoming a great actor. Expand your awareness of the different aspects of movie making. Gain tools to help you be in the moment, find honesty in your work, and hone your artistry as a film actor. Work with other dedicated young actors and industry professionals to create short films to be shared with audiences throughout the year.

Sketch Comedy and Improv Troupe

Take your comedic and improv skills to the next level with the new Sketch Comedy and Improv Troupe. Through a mixture of improvisation and writing, young actors will create original sketch shows and improve performances throughout the year. Industry professionals will help you develop your technique, discipline and artistry. Sketch Comedy and Improv Troupe members showcase their work as part of Winter Shorts, and Expressions Theatre Festival, as well as mid-term performances in the Poole Theatre in order to maximize performance opportunities with an audience.

AUDITION INFORMATION

You may audition for multiple Troupes – you can select which Troupes you'll be auditioning for on the form. Audition slots are given on a first come, first serve bases. Apply early to guarantee an audition time.

- 1. Go to www.artsumbrella.com/advanced-programs/ and click 'Register For An Audition.'
- 2. Complete the questionnaire as best as you can.
- 3. Please note that:
 - a) If you are auditioning for Musical Theatre, Film, or Theatre, you will receive a 15 minute audition slot when your questionnaire has been received
 - b) If you are auditioning for Sketch Comedy and Improv, you will be placed in a group audition time-slot.
- 4. On the day of your audition, arrive at Arts Umbrella 10-15 minutes early to ensure that you are ready to go at your scheduled audition time.

How do I prepare for my audition?

If you would like to be considered for **Musical Theatre Troupe** you must prepare a song from the Musical Theatre canon. Make sure you have sheet music to bring with you to your audition. Sheet music can be found in hard copy at libraries, or online at resources including composer's personal websites, musicnotes.com, and sheetmusicdirect.com

Learn <u>this dance combo posted posted on Vimeo</u> (password: MTAudition). For rehearsal purposes, "Seize the Day" from "Newsies" can be found on <u>Youtube</u> and <u>Spotify</u> (the combo starts at around 4:40). Music will provided at the audition.

If you would like to be considered for **Theatre Troupe** you must memorize and prepare a monologue from a published play. Choose a piece that speaks to you and make sure you read the play to get as much information about the character and story as possible. If you are

If you would like to be considered for **The Actor's Film Troupe** you must memorize and prepare a monologue from a published play. Choose a piece that speaks to you and make sure you read the play to get as much information about the character and story as possible.

You must prepare this film scene to be read with a reader at your audition. You may choose whichever character you'd like and a reader will play the scene with you at your audition

If you would like to be considered for **Sketch Comedy and Improv Troupe** you will be placed in a 30 minute group audition where you will be lead through a warm up and some improv scenes to see how you work with others and your boldness in your work.
